Recently, we began the **Marion County Broadband Feasibility Study**. This study consists of two eCheckup surveys that will help the county better determine where new or improved internet services will make the most impact throughout all corners of the county.

We've partnered with Televate, an internet consultancy, to build two eCheckups — one for households, and another for businesses. While these eCheckups are a bit longer than the average survey, all of the data collected is important — we're looking at not just internet speeds, but also how Marion County residents use their internet services.

The more responses we receive, the better and more accurate the data. This data will then be used to apply for state and federal grants to help improve internet infrastructure throughout the county.
